

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


- The letters (A through V) in the Block image below are linked with the parts in the "CUTTING TABLE," "COORDINATE THE COLORS" and "MAKE THE MAILBOX." Please label all the parts according to the instructions.
- **Mailbox** in the Block image (Groups 1 through 4) is linked with "**COORDINATE THE COLORS**" on Page 5.
- The cutting instructions include ¹/₄" seam allowance.
- WOF: width of fabric (Yardage: about 42" / Fat quarter (FQ) & Fat eighth: 21", unless otherwise mentioned)
- Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to sew.
- Press the seam allowances in the direction of the arrows, unless otherwise mentioned.
- CST = Corner Square Triangle





PREPARATION for BABY and LARGE THROW (YARDAGE & SCRAPPY)

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the squares below.

• **B**, **C**, **G** and **H**

COORDINATE THE COLORS for THE MAILBOX

Each mailbox has four (4) color groups as indicated in the tables below (Groups 1 through 4). Each group should be one (1) color of your choice. Also refer to the diagram on Page 1.

Baby and Large Throw (Scrappy):

Gather the pieces to create one (1) mailbox. You need four (4) mailboxes for Baby and sixteen (16) for Large Throw (Scrappy).


Large Throw (Yardage):

Gather the pieces to create four (4) sets of four (4) mailboxes each. You will need sixteen (16) mailboxes in total. Each set of 4 mailboxes should have its own color scheme of your choice.



MAKE THE MAILBOX BLOCK


 RST, layer the marked Square B onto the top corner of Rectangle A. Sew on the marked line and trim ¼" away from the stitched line, press. (CST) Repeat the steps with the other top corner. (Diagram 1)



 RST, layer the marked Square C onto the bottom of Rectangle A from Step 1 and sew the pieces using CST method. Repeat the steps with the other piece from Step 1 but sew in the opposite diagonal direction. (Diagram 2)



 RST, sew the pieces from Step 2 and press seam open. Then sew Rectangle D to both the right and left side, press. (Diagram 3)



- 4. RST, sew Rectangle **E** to the top and Rectangle **F** to the bottom of the piece from Step 3, press. (Diagram 4)
- RST, layer the marked Square G onto the top left corner and Square H to the top right corner of the piece from Step 4. Sew the pieces using CST method. (Diagram 5)





 RST, sew Rectangle I to the right side of the piece from Step 5 and press. Then sew Rectangle J to the top and press. (Diagram 6)






 RST, sew Rectangle K, L and M together, press. RST, sew Rectangle N to the left side and press. Then sew Rectangle O to the top and Rectangle P to the bottom, press. (Diagram 7)



 RST, layer the marked Square G onto the top right corner of Rectangle Q. Sew the pieces using CST method. Then sew Rectangle R to the top and press. (Diagram 8)



 Gather the units from Step 6, 7 and 8. RST, sew them together and press. (Diagram 10) RST, sew the unit from Step 9 to the bottom and press. (Diagram 11) Then sew Rectangle V to both the right and left side to complete the mailbox. (Diagram 12) Set them aside.



11. Gather the strips for strip piecing.

Baby: RST, sew all four strips along the long edge and press seams open. The pieced strip set measures at 8 ½" x WOF.

Large Throw (Yardage): Take one of each color strip. RST, sew all four strips along the long edge and press seams open. The pieced strip set measures at 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Make 2.

Large Throw (Scrappy): From sixteen strips, take four strips of your choice and sew them along the long edge, press seams open. Repeat the steps with other strips. The pieced strip set measures at 8 ½" x WOF. Make 4.

- 12. Trim the salvage and cross cut 2 ½" strips. Make sure to cut at a 90 degree angle to the pieced lines. There is extra room to trim and straighten up if needed. (Diagram 13) Diagram 13 Diagram 13
 - Take two 2 ¹/₂" strips from Step 12 and sew them as shown. (Diagram 14)







NOTE: For Large Throw (Scrappy), feel free to mix up the cut strip pieces!

14. Gather the units from Step 10 (Diagram 12) and 13. You must make two types of the blocks as shown below (Block 1 and Block 2). Pay attention to the number of blocks you need for each block type.



- Baby: Make 4 blocks
- Large Throw
 - Yardage: Make 2 blocks from each set of four mailboxes
 - Scrappy: Make 8 blocks



- Baby: None
- Large Throw
 - Yardage: Make 2 blocks from each set of four mailboxes
 - Scrappy: Make 8 blocks

NOTE: For Large Throw (Scrappy), you may want to lay the mailbox units out first to see the color placements. Then you can decide on which pieced strip unit goes with each mailbox unit before sewing.

MAKE THE SASHING

Cut the pieces as indicated in the table below.

Large Throw: For the sashing between the rows, piece the strips along the short edge and make a long strip. Measure and cut as indicated in the table below.

MAKE THE BORDERS

Baby: Cut the pieces as indicated in the table below.

Large Throw: Piece the strips along the short edge and make a long strip. Measure and cut as indicated in the table below.

ASSEMBLE THE QUILT TOP

- 1. Lay out the blocks. Refer to the quilt top images on Page 10 for each size.
- 2. Piece each row with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing between the blocks and press toward sashing.
- 3. Sew the pieced rows together with the pieced sashing between them. Press toward sashing.
- 4. Piece the borders to each side, then piece the top and bottom. Press toward the borders. Press toward borders.

PREPARE THE BACKING

Cut the backing fabric in half. You will get approximately


(2) 49"x WOF for **Baby**

(2) 90"x WOF for Large Throw


Trim the selvage and piece them together with the trimmed edge. Press seam open. Trim the excess fabric.

COMPLETE THE QUILT


To make the quilt sandwich, you need the quilt top, batting and backing fabric. Place the backing fabric right side down, the batting on top, then place the quilt top right side up. Baste the layers together, quilt and bind using your preferred method.
