


BOUNCING DIAMONDS

Before Getting Started

- Read all directions before starting.
- All seam allowances are 1/4"
- RST means Right Sides Together
- WOF means Width of Fabric and assumes 42" wide
- Press seams outward as block is made from the center and working your way out



Fabric Requirements

	BABY SIZE 42" × 46"
Fabric A	% yard
Fabric B	½ yard
Fabric C	1 yard
Binding	½ yard
Backing	2 ½ yards
Batting	50" X 54"

Cutting Instructions


	BABY 42" X 46"
Fabric A	☐ (13) 1 ½ " x WOF strips subcut into ☐ (90) 1½" x 3" ☐ (90) 1½" x 5"
Fabric B	□ (4) 3" x WOF stripssubcut into□ (45) 3" x 5"
Fabric C	□ (6) 5" x WOF strips subcut into □ (45) 5" x 5"



To make your quilt scrappy, use fabrics from your stash and follow the cutting instructions for fabric C or for fabric C and D. A list of how many of each size fabric is listed under cutting instructions. You will still follow the same sewing instruction as listed below.

Block A Assembly

1. Sew RST (1) 3" Fabric A square to (2) 3"x1½" Fabric B rectangle. See Figure 1.



2. Sew RST Figure 1 to (2) 5"x1½" Fabric B rectangle. See Figure 2.




3. On the wrong side of Fabric C square, draw (1) line diagonally, corner to corner.

If you using an "Air Erasable Pen", I suggest only drawing a line on a couple of squares at a time.

4. Place Figure 2 and Fabric C RST. Sew ¼", on each side of your diagonal line,



5. Cut along diagonal line, as shown in Figure



6. You will now have 2 HST's. Trim all HST to $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".




7. Open HST and press seams. You should have (90) 4½" squares.

Quilt Top Assembly

- Follow the assembly diagrams for this section.
- Sew rows together. Press seams in one direction per row (as shown with arrow). Alternate direction of seams with each column. This will help nest seams and align rows.
- Be mindful of the direction of your blocks. Laying your quilt out before sewing blocks together will help with any confusion of which direction your block should be facing.



Finishing Your Quilt

- 1. Piece backing if needed and press seams.
- 2. Make a quilt sandwich by laying backing wrong side up, batting and then quilt top right side up.
- 3. Baste quilt as desired.
- 4. Quilt as desired.
- 5. Cut excess batting and backing.
- 6. Square up quilt.
- 7. Bind using your 2 ½" binding strips.
- 8. Congratulations! You finished your quilt. Enjoy!
