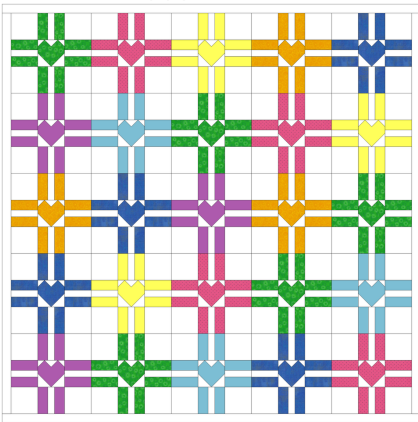

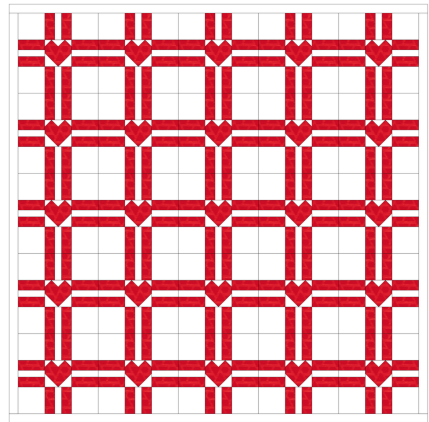
BEFORE GETTING STARTED

- All seams 1/4"
- FQ = Fat Quarter (20" x 17")

 Color	1 ¼ yards	2 yards	3 yards
Background	1 ¾ yards	2 ⅝ yards	4 yards
Backing	3 ¼ yards	4 yards	5 ¼ yards
Binding	½ yard	⅝ yard	¾ yard
Scrappy Hearts			
Fat Quarters 1 = 3 blocks	6 FQ	9 FQ	14 FQ

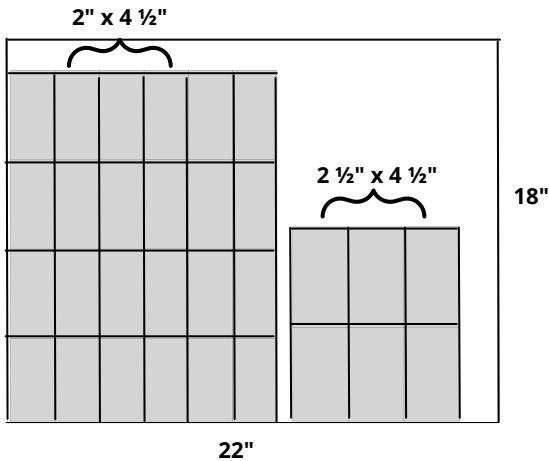
CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

	CRIB	THROW	TWIN
 Color	-Cut (2) 4 ½ x WOF subcut (32) 4 ½ x 2 ½ -Cut (16) 2 x WOF	-Cut (4) 4 ½ x WOF subcut (50) 4 ½ x 2 ½ -Cut (24) 2 x WOF	-Cut (6) 4 ½ x WOF subcut (84) 4 ½ x 2 ½ -Cut (38) 2 x WOF
Background	-Cut (8) 4 ½ x WOF subcut (64) 4 ½ x 4 ½ -Cut (8) 1½ x WOF -Cut (2) 2½ x WOF subcut (32) 2½ x 2½ -Cut (3) 1½ x WOF subcut (64) 1½ x 1½	-Cut (12) 4½ x WOF subcut (100) 4½ x 4½ -Cut (12) 1½ x WOF -Cut (4) 2½ x WOF subcut (50) 2½ x 2½ -Cut (4) 1½ x WOF Subcut (100) 1½ x 1½	-Cut (19) 4½ x WOF subcut (168) 4 ½ x 4 ½ -Cut (19) 1½ x WOF -Cut (6) 2 ½ x WOF Subcut (84) 2 ½ x 2 ½ -Cut (6) 1½ x WOF subcut (168) 1½ x 1½
Binding	(6) 2 ½" x WOF strips	(7) 2 ½" x WOF strips	(8) 2 ½" x WOF strips

Fat quarter cutting layout

(1 FQ yields 3 heart blocks)

NOTE: To avoid cutting more pieces than needed, for Crib and Throw size – from 1 FQ only cut enough for one block: (8) 2" x 4 ½" and (2) 2 ½" x 4 ½"



Cut: (24) 2 x 4 ½"
(6) 2 ½ x 4 ½"

BLOCK ASSEMBLY

1. Begin by making two equal stacks of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles. You will have the following number in each stack: Baby (16) Throw (25) Twin (42) Fig. 1

2. Draw a diagonal line on the back of all 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares and all 1 ½" x 1 ½" squares. Fig. 2

3. Place a 2 ½" x 2 ½" square at the bottom of each rectangle from stacks A and B. Make sure the drawn line is facing in the direction shown in Fig. 3. Stitch on the drawn line.

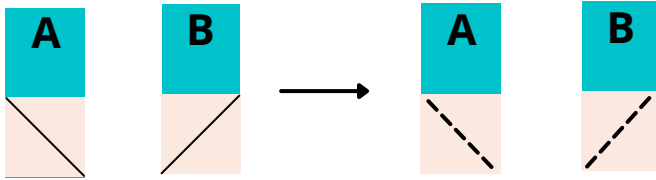

4. Trim ¼" from the stitching line. Open and press toward the triangle. Fig. 4

5. Place a 1 ½" x 1 ½" square at the top right of each rectangle from both stacks. Make sure the drawn line is facing in the direction shown in Fig. 5. Stitch on the drawn line. Trim ¼" from the stitching line. Open and press toward triangle.

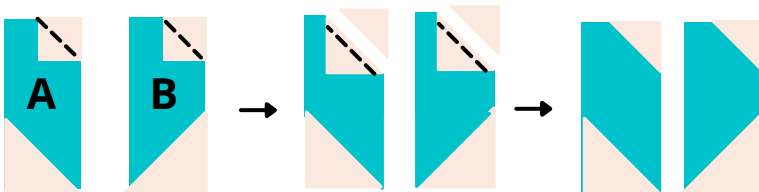

6. Repeat step 5 above to sew the remaining $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to the upper left corner of each rectangle. Press toward triangle. Fig. 6

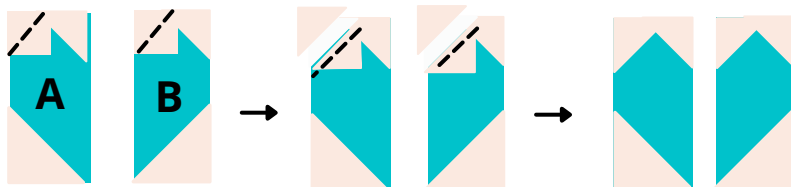

7. You now have two sides of your heart block. Place right sides together and sew the two pieces to form your heart block. Press seam to one side. Block measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Fig. 7.

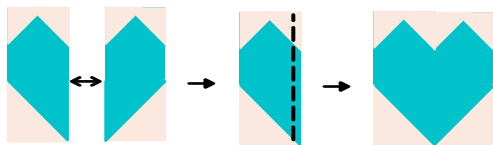

8. Sew two 2" WOF color strips to one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF background strip. Press seams open. Make the following number of strip sets: (Baby 8/Throw 12/Twin 19}. Fig. 8

9. Subcut $4\frac{1}{2}$ " sections totaling (Baby 64/Throw 100/Twin 168). Fig. 9

NOTE: If using fat quarters, subcut the background $1\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF strips into (64/100/168) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " sections. Sew to the color 2" x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces to achieve strip set blocks shown in Fig 9 above.

10. Lay out your pieces according to Fig. 10. Sew rows together and press in direction of arrows.

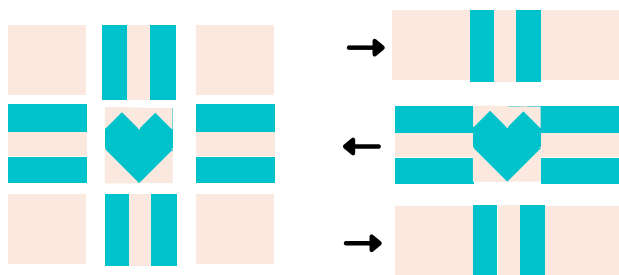

11. Sew rows together to complete your block. Fig. 11

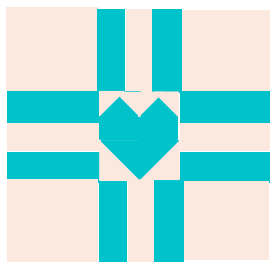

QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY

12. Sew blocks together to make rows. Fig. 12. Press each row in direction of arrows as illustrated in Fig. 13.

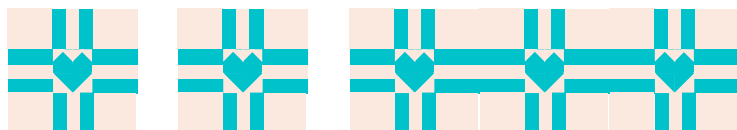

13. Sew rows together to complete your quilt top. Press. (Fig. 13)

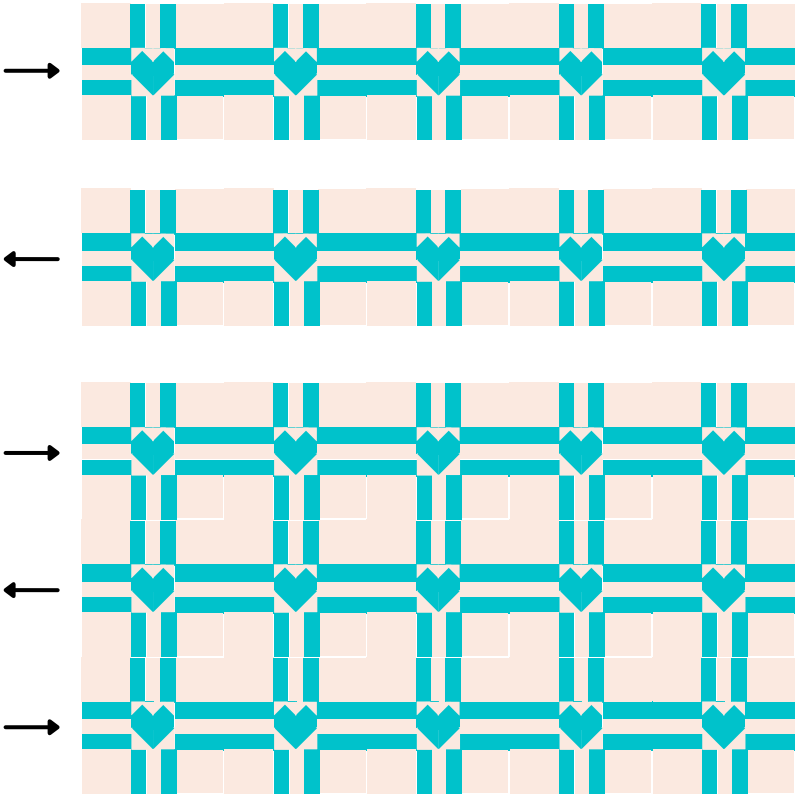
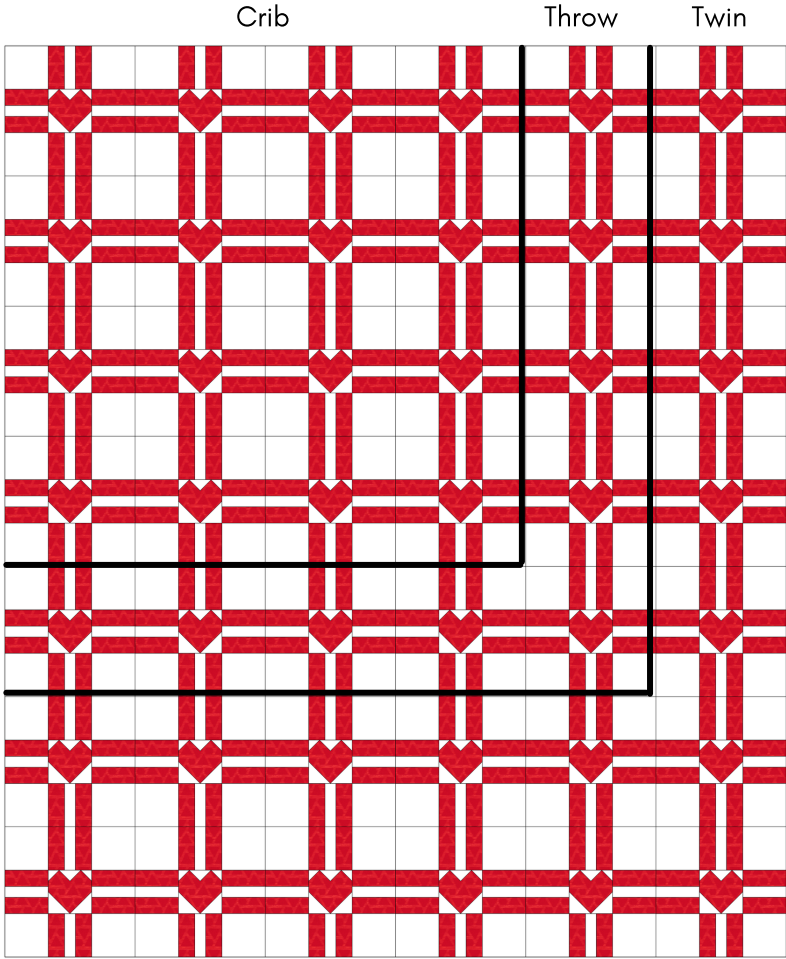

14. Your quilt top is done. Baste, quilt and bind in your desired method.

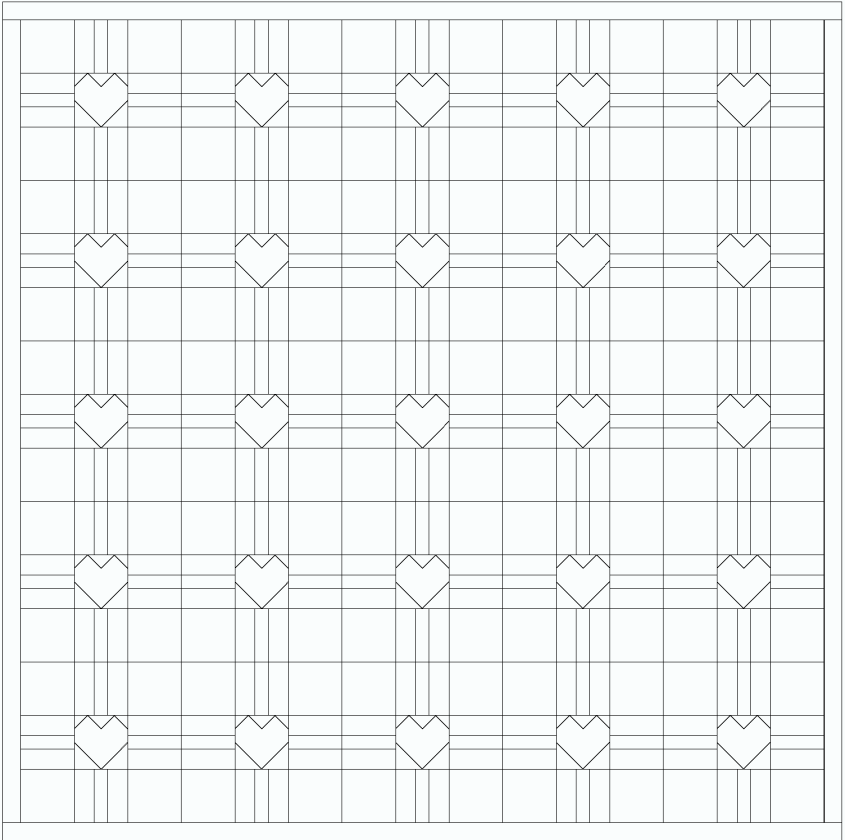
Darling Hearts Quilt Layout
