

	SAWTOOTH TWIST BLOCK By Mary Davis	
	Fabric Pieces Needed:	Note: All seams 1/4" Block Size: 12" finished
	Color A (2) 4 1/2" squares	
	Color B (2) 4 1/2" squares (2) 1 3/4" squares	
	Color C (2) 4 1/2" squares (2) 1 3/4" squares	
	Color D (4) 3 1/2" squares (6) 4 1/2" squares	
Instructions for making two-at-a-time half square triangles (HST)		




- 1. Place two squares rights sides together. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of one square. (Fig. 1)
- 2. Stitch 1/4" from the drawn line, on both sides. (Fig. 2)
- 3. Cut on the drawn line. (Fig. 3)
- 4. Open and press toward the dark fabric. (Fig. 4)
- 5. Trim all HST to 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" square.

Make the following HSTs



- Pair together two sets of 4 1/2" Color A and Color D squares, make 4 HST.
- Pair together two sets of 4 1/2" Color B and Color D squares, make 4 HST.
- Pair together two sets of 4 1/2" Color C and Color D squares, make 4 HST .





1. Take the (4) 1 3/4" B and C squares and draw a line on the wrong side from corner to corner. (Fig. 5)

2. Using the 4 C/D HST units made in above, place (1) 1 3/4" square on the corner of each Color D - right sides together. Stitch on the drawn line. (Fig. 6)

- 3. Trim 1/4" from the seam. (Fig. 7)
- 4. Press open. (Fig. 8)

5. Following block assembly diagram below, sew together in rows and press seams in direction of arrows.

6. Sew completed rows together to form your block.
